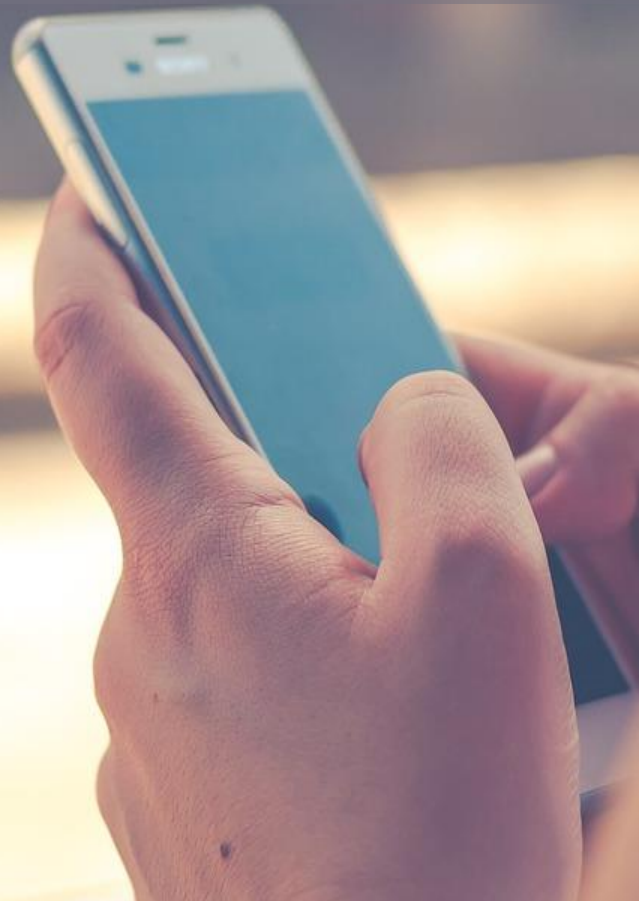

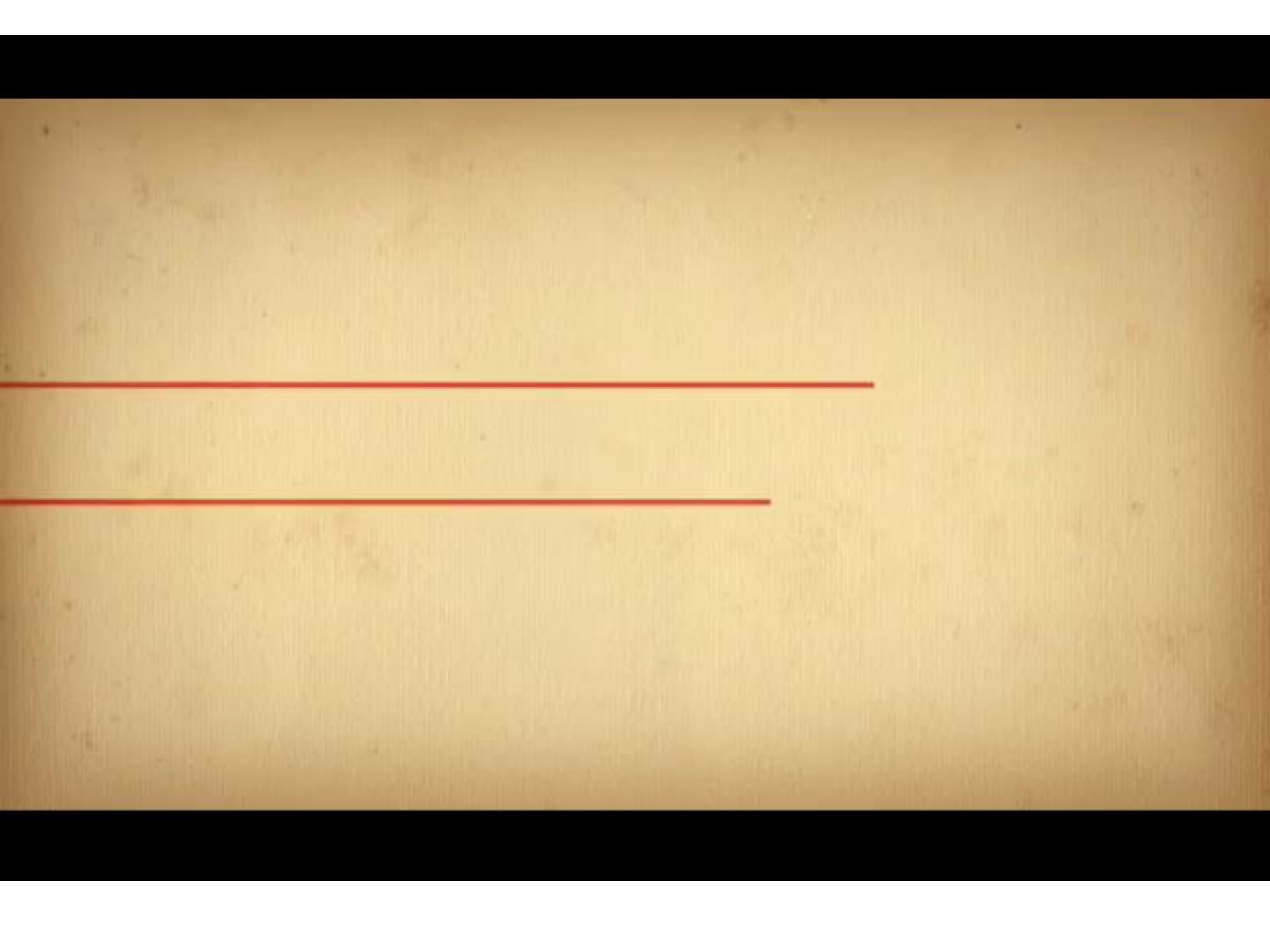

Since open government and data openness are now a **public policy** in Brazil and an **international commitment**, we have started a series of audits to **evaluate government actions** and to **induce improvements**

Last year government representatives from France, UK, Australia, South Korea, European Union, Estonia, Singapour, USA, Holand, Turkey participated of a seminar lead by TCU to share experiences on Digital Government
